PHONE THREAT PROCEDURES

Most bomb threats and swatting calls are received by phone or email. All threats should be taken seriously until proven otherwise. Act quickly. Remain calm. Obtain information using the checklist on the front and back of this card.

- Do not hang up, even if you think the caller does.
- Keep the caller on the phone as long as possible.
- Listen carefully.
- Ask the caller questions. Repeat the same questions. This may help identify inconsistencies. See questions
- Write down as much detail as possible.
- If possible, signal a colleague to contact 911.
- Write down the phone number or letters on the display.
- Record the call, if possible.
- Follow your organization's emergency procedures.
- Law enforcement receiving the threat should attempt to make contact with the school.
